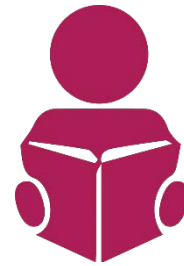

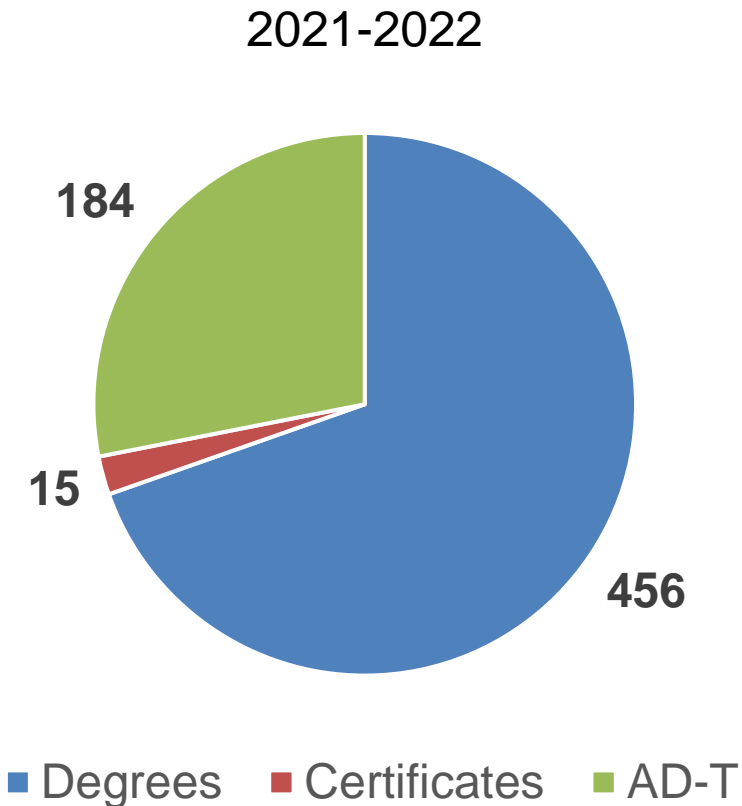

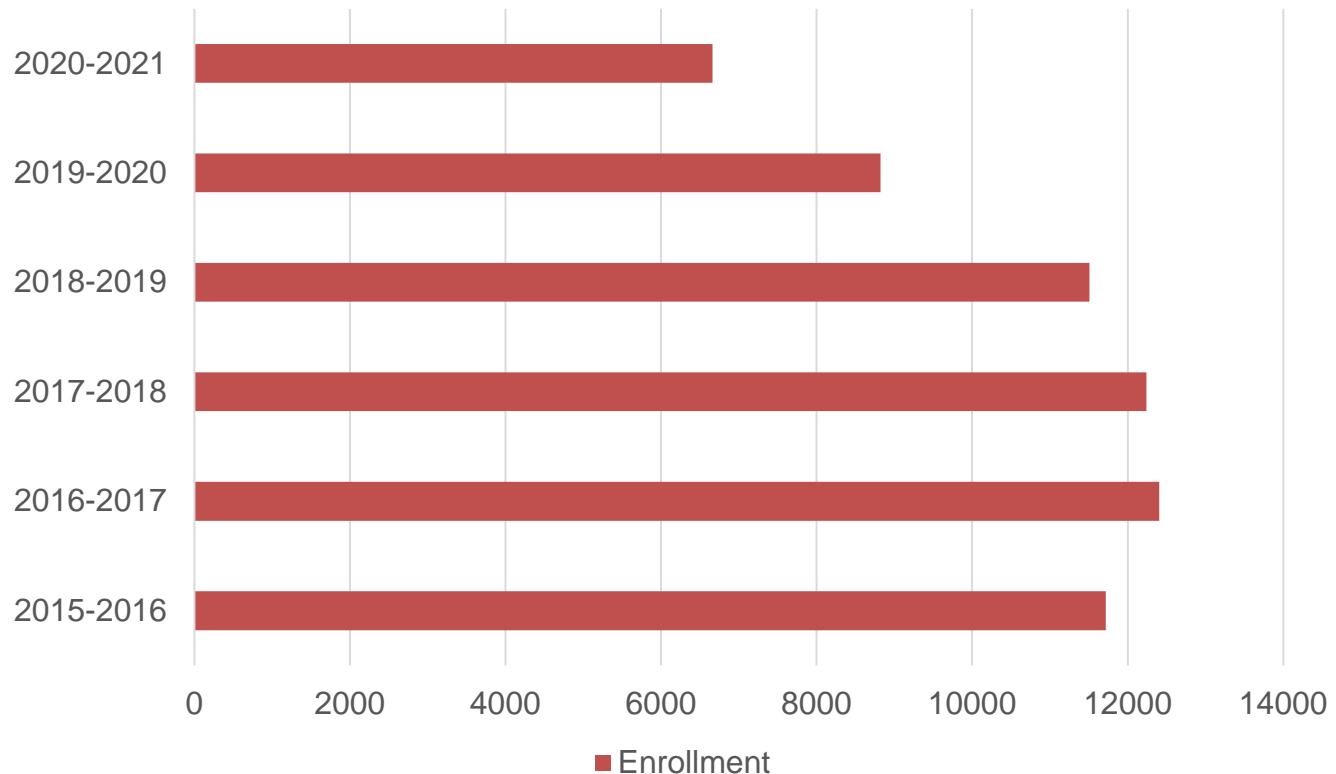

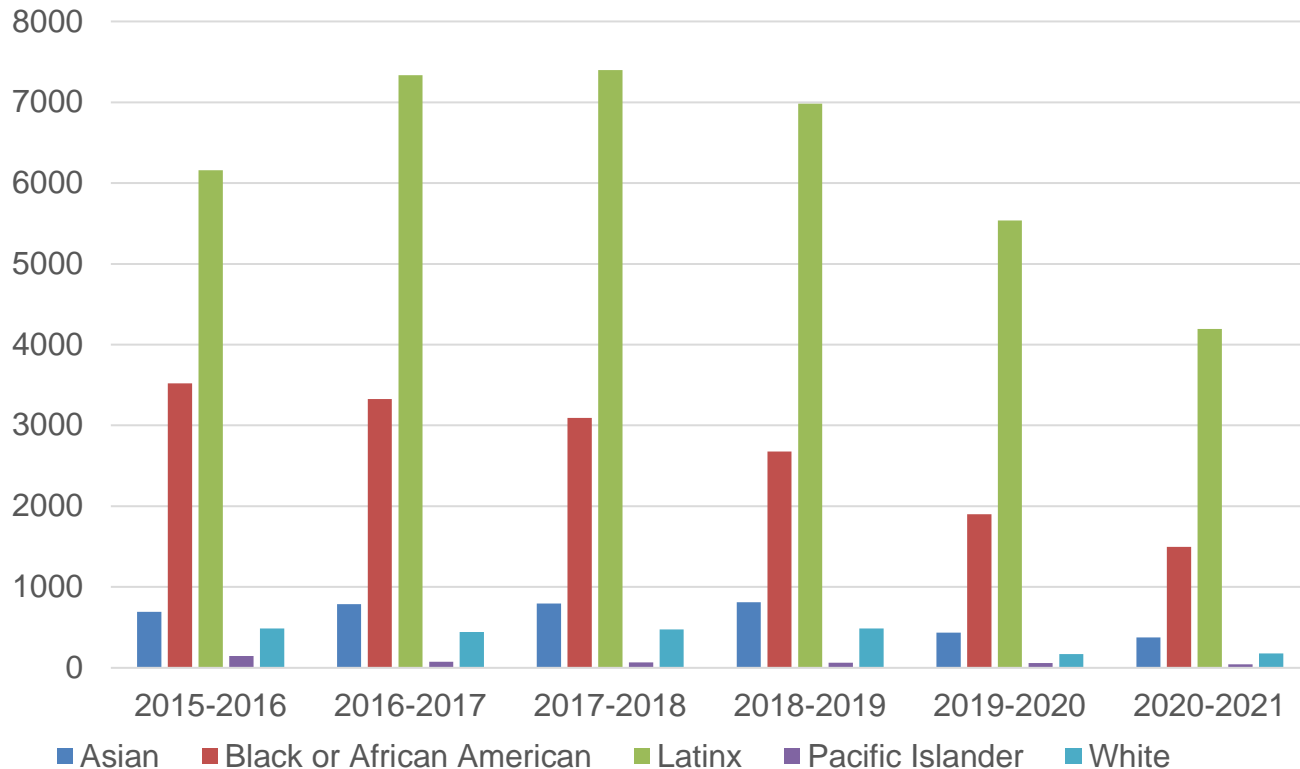

Student Ethnicity



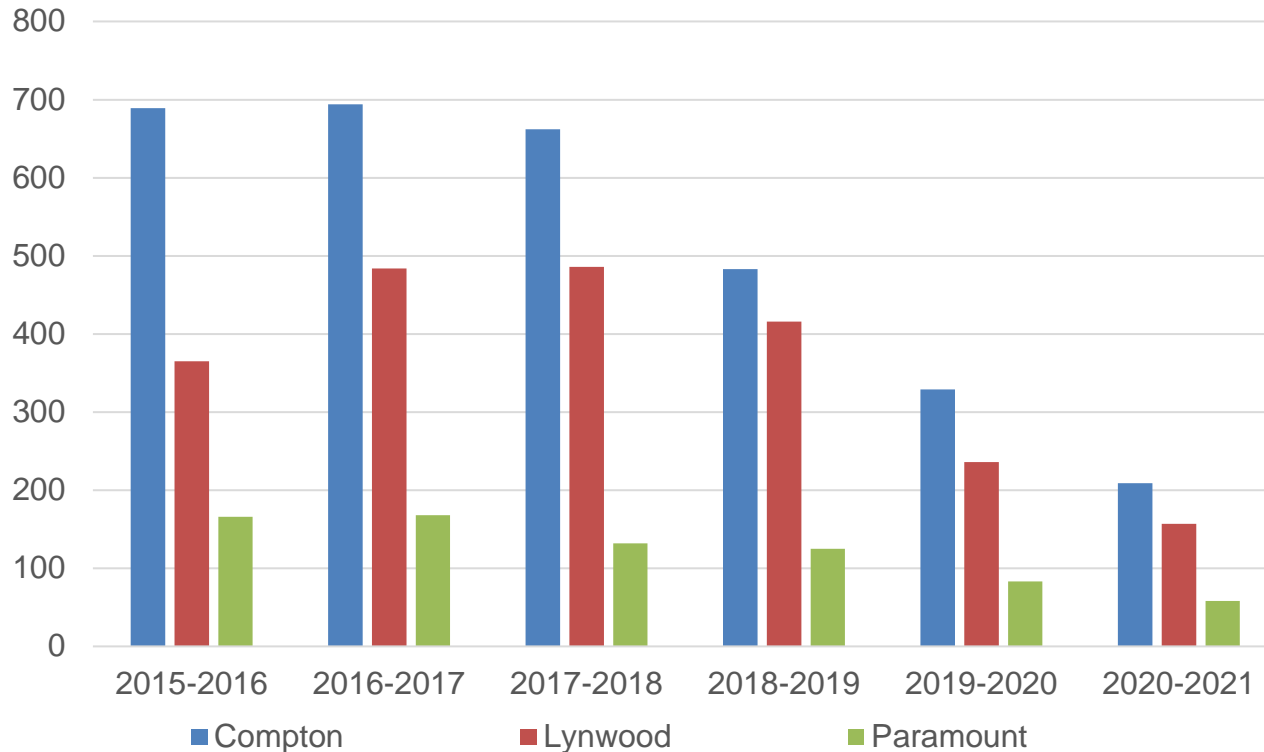

Steps to Enrollment

1. **APPLY FOR ADMISSION** - Take the first step – it's fast and easy! Complete and submit your free application online.
2. **FINANCIAL AID** - Need help paying for college? Apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA or CADAA.
3. **ORIENTATION** - Orientation provides an introduction to academic programs and support services to help you succeed.
4. **EDUCATIONAL PLANNING** - Focus on your goal! Meet with a counselor and complete an educational plan to identify classes that are required to complete your certificate, degree or transfer program.
5. **REGISTER FOR CLASSES** - Ready to register for classes? Login to MyCompton and register for classes on or after your assigned Ticket Time (registration appointment).

FACILITIES UPDATE



New Instructional Building 1

\$21.2 million state-of-the-art instructional building



Current Construction Projects

Student Services Building: The \$25.2 million facility will become a one-stop hub for all student services. Estimated Completion: Spring 2023



Current Construction Projects

Instructional Building 2: The \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus. Estimated Completion: Spring/Summer 2023



Future Construction Projects

Compton College Physical Education Complex: This \$45.6 million project includes the demolition of the current gymnasium, men's shower/locker, classroom V, pool service, pool, and women's shower/locker buildings; and the construction of a new gymnasium, men's and women's locker room, faculty office space, and physical education support space.



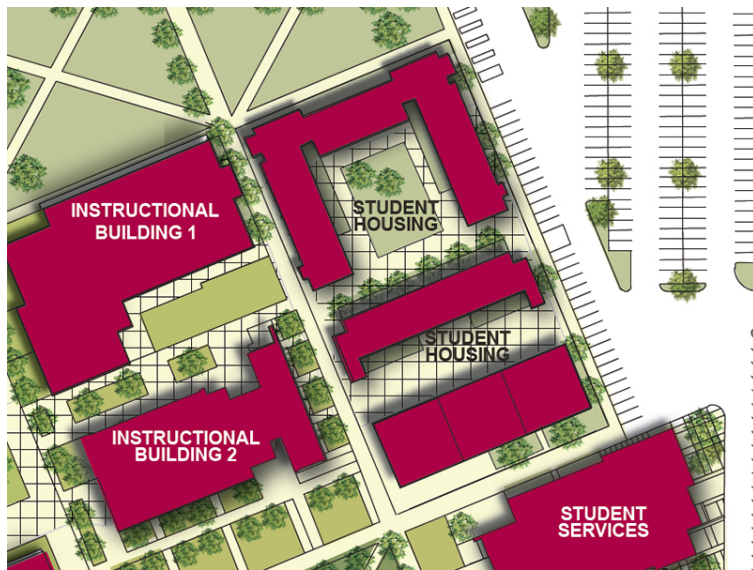
Future Construction Projects

Compton College Visual and Performing Arts Complex: This \$13.4 million project includes a new facility to support music, dance, performing arts, film and video programs. Strategic placement of this new facility, adjacent to the renovated Little Theater, provides space for an outdoor courtyard.



Future Construction Projects

On June 26, 2022, California lawmakers moved to include a student housing grant totaling \$80,389,000 in the 2022-2023 State Budget for the Compton Community College District (CCCD) to build its proposed **250-bed student housing facility on the Compton College campus.**



- The proposed Compton College student housing will be located at the northeast corner of campus.
- Phase one of the 86,000-square-foot building will include four floors of affordable student living quarters with 100 percent occupancy earmarked for eligible low-income students.
- The facility will provide three types of living configurations: 50 double-room units with access to shared bathrooms and common spaces, 50 double-suite units with bathrooms and access to common spaces, and 50 studio units for single occupants for a combined total of 250 beds.
- Amenity spaces will include study areas/lounges, and shared kitchens.
- Phase two of this student housing project will include an additional 200 beds with a mix of double and single occupancy units.

EMERGENCY AID



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Vaccine Incentive

Conclusion of \$350 Vaccine Incentive for students:

- \$1,366,750 distributed to 3,906 students

The student vaccination requirement ended January 1, 2023.

- Proof of full vaccination status no longer be required for in-person classes beginning with the winter 2023 term.

Student Debt Forgiveness

In an effort to remove financial barriers and encourage students to return to college, the Compton CCD Board of Trustees approved a resolution to forgive outstanding enrollment fees.

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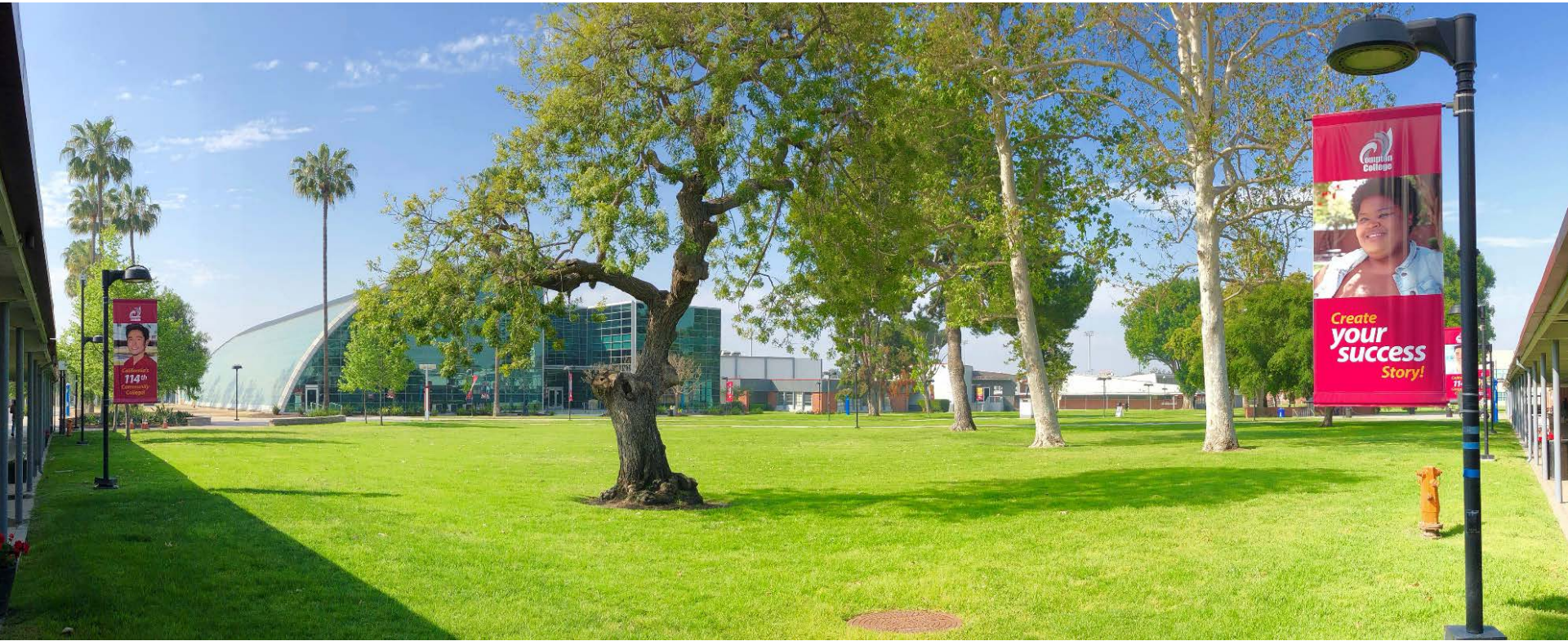
Addressing Hunger on Campus

- **Monthly Mobile Food Pantry**
 - Partnership with Los Angeles Regional Food Bank
 - Open to the public
 - March 14, April 11, May 9, and June 13
- **Free Everytable meals daily at the on-campus cafeteria**
 - One meal daily for students and employees
- **Everytable meal delivery service**
 - Students may order ten meals per week

Addressing Hunger on Campus

Weekly Farmers' Market

- Partnership with Sustainable Economic Enterprise of Los Angeles (SEE-LA)
- Open to the Public
- \$20 vouchers for students; including dual enrolled students
 - On average, 163 students pick up vouchers each week
 - Total Amount Disbursed: \$45,738

Compton College Promise Program



- The Compton College Oliver W. Conner Promise Program was established to make a college education more accessible and affordable to high school graduates from the Compton, Lynwood and Paramount unified school districts.
- The College Promise program covers the first two years of enrollment fees at Compton College, beginning with the fall semester, after you graduate from high school.


Compton College Promise Program

Benefits Include:

- **Guaranteed admission** to Compton College.
- **\$400 per year for textbooks and course materials and supplies.**
- **Tablet/laptop loan program** during the first two years at Compton College.
Students are allowed to keep their college-issued tablet/laptop if they are enrolled full-time at census for the third semester.
- **Priority registration** at Compton College before graduating from high school for CUSD, LUSD, and PUSD seniors.
- **Opportunities to participate in support programs** such as the First Year Experience (FYE) and Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS).
- Assistance with the completion of a **Financial Fit Plan** to help high school graduates access all available financial aid to help pay for college.
- **Summer Bridge classes** to assist with a successful transition to college level courses.

How to Apply for Financial Aid

All students are encouraged to apply for financial aid, even if you don't think you will qualify. If you think you need help paying for fees, books and other expenses, you should apply. Citizens and eligible non-citizens can complete the FAFSA, while other non-citizens can complete the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) instead.

- To apply for financial aid students must complete a **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at www.fafsa.gov. (Compton College's school code is 042817.)
- Undocumented/Dreamer Students should complete the **California Dream Act Application** (CADAA). (Use school code 04281700.)

Important Financial Aid Dates & Deadlines

Date/Deadline	Description
October 1	Every year, the new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the next academic year becomes available.
February 28	Deadline to submit Compton College Scholarship Application
March 2	Cal Grant: Priority deadline for applicants to file their FAFSA or Dream Application and GPA form to be considered for Cal Grant (state grant) eligibility and maximize their aid.
June 30	Last day to complete and submit a FAFSA for the current academic year.
June 30	Fee Waiver: Deadline to apply for the California Community Colleges Promise Grant (Fee Waiver) for the current academic year.
September 2	Cal Grant: Second deadline for applicants to file their FAFSA or Dream Application and GPA form to be considered for Cal Grant (state grant) Competitive Awards (only for California community colleges)
