Tristan is now preparing to enter the law enforcement field with hopes of joining the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.




Rodney Lister has worked as a financial analyst and business services specialist, and has procured several bonds utilizing federal dollars for repayment




2021-2022 Unduplicated Headcount (California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office)




STATE OF THE COLLEGE







FACILITIES UPDATE



New Instructional Building 1

\$22.3 million state-of-the-art instructional building, opened in Fall 2021





New Student Services Building

The \$25.2 million facility is a one-stop hub for all student services. Grand opening was held on April 22, 2023.



Current Construction Projects

Instructional Building 2: The \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus. Estimated Completion: late Fall 2023



Future Construction Projects

Compton College Physical Education Complex: This \$45.6 million project includes the demolition of the current gymnasium, men's shower/locker, classroom V, pool service, pool, and women's shower/locker buildings; and the construction of a new gymnasium, men's and women's locker room, faculty office space, and physical education support space. Estimated completion: Spring 2026





Future Construction Projects

Compton College Visual and Performing Arts Complex: This \$16 million project includes a new facility to support music, dance, performing arts, film and video programs. Strategic placement of this new facility, adjacent to the renovated Little Theater, provides space for an outdoor courtyard. Estimated completion: Winter 2026





Future Construction Projects

On June 26, 2022, California lawmakers moved to include a student housing grant totaling \$80,389,000 in the 2022-2023 State Budget for the Compton Community College District (CCCD) to build its proposed 250-bed student housing facility on the Compton College campus. Estimated completion: Spring 2025



- The proposed Compton College student housing will be located at the northeast corner of campus.
- Amenity spaces will include study areas/lounges, and shared kitchens.
- The facility will provide three types of living configurations: 50 double-room units with access to shared bathrooms and common spaces, 50 doublesuite units with bathrooms and access to common spaces, and 50 studio units for single occupants for a combined total of 250 beds.

Student Debt Forgiveness

In an effort to remove financial barriers and encourage students to return to college, the Compton CCD Board of Trustees approved a resolution to forgive outstanding enrollment fees.

 - On average, 265 students pick up vouchers each week
 - Total Amount Disbursed: \$204,809

Tartar Pantry

- -- Located in the multipurpose room by the cafeteria.
- -- Students enrolled in the current semester of instruction are allowed to visit the pantry twice a week.



OUR PROMISE. YOUR FUTURE.





- Through the Compton College Oliver W. Conner Promise Program, students graduating from the Compton, Lynwood, and Paramount unified school districts were able to attend Compton College with enrollment fees waived.
- The Compton Promise expanded in fall 2023 to include all first-time college students* (including part-time students), regardless if they live within the boundaries of the Compton CCD, as long as they meet the following requirements:
 - Submit a complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) for the term they are applying for and receive an "award package."
 - 2. Enroll in a minimum of six units per term (for a minimum of three consecutive terms).



\$46 per unit enrollment fees will be waived** for up to 15 units per term (for up to two years) as long as the student:

- Remains enrolled in a minimum of six units at census.
- Receives a 2.0+ GPA
- Maintains a 66.7% completion rate

The Compton Promise program will provide the following services during the first two years:

- Up to \$400 a year for books and course supplies.
- Tablet/laptop loan program, where students who enroll in three consecutive terms may keep their Compton College-issued tablet/laptop free of charge.
- Students who meet the specific requirements for admission to University of California, Irvine through the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) will be eligible to receive support and services through the Compton College Promise Graduate Advantage.
- Compton College will assist students to complete the required Registration Steps for full-time enrollment.
- Incoming students will receive Priority Registration to Compton College before graduating from high school.
- Compton College will provide Summer Bridge to assist with college transition.

FINANCIAL AID



How to Apply for Financial Aid

All students are encouraged to apply for financial aid, even if you don't think you will qualify. If you think you need help paying for fees, books and other expenses, you should apply. Citizens and eligible non-citizens can complete the FAFSA, while other non-citizens can complete the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) instead.

- To apply for financial aid students must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov. (Compton College's school code is 042817.)
- Undocumented/Dreamer Students should complete the <u>California</u>
 <u>Dream Act</u> Application (CADAA). (Use school code 04281700.)

Important Financial Aid Dates & Deadlines

Date/Deadline	Description
October 1	Every year, the new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the next academic year becomes available.
February 28	Deadline to submit Compton College Scholarship Application
March 2	Cal Grant: Priority deadline for applicants to file their FAFSA or Dream Application and GPA form to be considered for Cal Grant (state grant) eligibility and maximize their aid.
June 30	Last day to complete and submit a FAFSA for the current academic year.
June 30	Fee Waiver: Deadline to apply for the California Community Colleges Promise Grant (Fee Waiver) for the current academic year.
September 2	Cal Grant: Second deadline for applicants to file their FAFSA or Dream Application and GPA form to be considered for Cal Grant (state grant) Competitive Awards (only for California community colleges)
