Final Spring 2024 Enrollment Numbers

As of *yesterday*, *April 25*, *2024*, Compton College generated 1,436 FTES for the Spring 2024 semester. The fill rate for Spring is 64%, and 10,203 seats are filled.

Summer 2024 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday*, *April 25*, *2024*, Compton College has generated 167 FTES for the Summer 2024 term. The fill rate is currently 22%, and seats filled are 1,212.

Summer enrollment is off to a good start. Please encourage interested students to register as soon as possible. Seven summer sections are already full, and others are nearing capacity. Click here to access the searchable schedule of classes.

Compton College Softball Update

On *April 19*, *2024*, the Compton College Softball Team celebrated the achievements of their five graduating sophomores in their last home game of the regular season. They worked hard both on and off the field, and their dedication to their studies. Danielle Varela, Jasmine Flores, Laila Vidales, Destiny Vega, and Eleana Rocha have each made valuable contributions to the team during their time at Compton College. Their commitment to excellence, both academically and athletically, is truly commendable.

Under the leadership of Head Coach Victoria Castillo, the softball team has shown tremendous growth this season. From a winless season last year to finishing with a winning record this year, the team has made great strides. With six players batting over 300 and a strong team slugging percentage of .392, it is clear that the hard work and dedication of both the players and the coaching staff have paid off.

As the team prepares for the upcoming regional playoffs, the entire Compton College community stands behind them, proud of what they have accomplished this season. The future looks bright for the Compton College Softball Team, and the departing sophomores can take pride in the legacy they leave behind.

A total of \$150,000 has been allocated in the 2024-2025 budget specifically for Teaching and Learning Professional Development Projects. 2024-2025 Compton Community College District Budget Assumptions

As mentioned in various <u>President/CEO Messages</u> this Spring, I shared a lot of information on the California State Budget, the projected deficit, and updates on the 2024-2025 Compton Community College District Budget Development. I am very concerned about the California state budget deficit, and therefore, we have made several adjustments to the Compton Community College District Five-Year Fiscal Management Plan. The adjustments are reflected in the 2024-2025 Compton CCD Budget Assumptions, which was included in the <u>President/CEO Message – April 5, 2024</u>, and is available <u>here</u> again. Currently, department managers/supervisors are working on their budgets for the 2024-2025 year, and the President/CEO cabinet is reviewing various budget augmentations/enhancements requests; I anticipate sharing decisions on those budget requests in a future President/CEO Message.

President/CEO Closing the Loop

- Originally approved for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 academic years, free parking permits for currently enrolled students have been extended another year. Compton College students are eligible to receive a free 2024-2025 parking permit by completing the online application (https://paymycite.com/Compton/parkingpermit.aspx). Upon completing the online transaction, students will receive an email with a link to download and print their student parking permits. *Please note:* the 2023-2024 student parking permits expire *June 30, 2024*. Students must complete a new application online and download the 2024-2025 permit that is valid from *July 1, 2024*, through *June 30, 2025*.
- Compton College students and employees may continue to pick up one free meal daily with their Compton College ID through *June 30, 2025*.
- Consistent with <u>Board Policy 2760 Board Political Activity and Resolutions</u>. I signed off on a joint coalition letter on behalf of Compton Community College District opposing <u>Senate Bill 1388</u>
 (Archuleta) Education finance: community colleges: general fund balance. A copy of the joint coalition letter is available here.

Final Thoughts

We are getting closer and closer to the end of the spring 2024 semester, and unlike other semesters, this one has been more difficult. We have lost several members of our college community family, and as a leader, this has been a difficult challenge.
