Welcome to the start of the spring semester! It has been wonderful to see everyone on campus bustling with energy and excitement once again. A special thank you to everyone who contributed to the success of our Welcome Week resource fair and those who staffed the multiple information tables. Your efforts have made the transition back to campus smooth and welcoming for all. I want to thank everyone for all you do to support student success at Compton College and for the community we serve.

This week, I also participated in my fifth meeting with the <u>National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity</u>, which took place over a day and a half starting *February 19, 2025*. I look forward to sharing insights with the Compton College <u>Accreditation Steering Committee</u>. Despite the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges reaffirming Compton College's accreditation for seven years in *June 2024*, I remain concerned about the future of accreditation and our ongoing implementation of standards. Spring 2025 Enrollment Update

As of *today, February 20, 2025*, Compton College generated 1,581 FTES for the Spring 2025 term. Our fill rate for Spring is currently 69%, and 11,021 seats are filled.

Once again, please continue to encourage continuing students to register for the spring 2025 semester, as *Every FTES Counts!* Admissions & Records has posted the list of open classes at www.compton.edu/admissions-aid/docs/Open-Sections.pdf. The list is updated at least once a week through the last day to add full-semester classes.

Reminder: *Sunday, March 2, 2025*, is the final day for students to add a class or drop a full-semester spring 2025 course without a notation on their records. Additionally, students who drop by this date will receive a full refund. Please ensure this information is communicated to all students promptly.

Compton College Grant Application Process

Compton College strategically and intentionally pursues grants that align with the institution's mission, existing grants, and current and upcoming priorities. The process to apply for a grant is documented in <u>Administrative Regulation 3280 - Grant Applications</u>. If you are interested in applying for a grant, please complete the Compton College <u>grant proposal application</u> as the first step. All grant proposals we pursue must be linked to the <u>Compton College 2035 Comprehensive Master Plan</u>. As I mentioned during my <u>Spring 2025 Professional Development Day Presentation</u>:

"We can't do it all, and we will have to decline potential partnerships and grant opportunities if they are not in alignment with Compton College 2035."

Your request will be reviewed by the Cabinet and the President/CEO, and you will be notified about whether the College will proceed with the formal proposal to the outside agency or foundation.

Legislative Update

The California Legislature reconvened on *January 6, 2025*, for the 2025-2026 session, with the deadline for new bill introductions set for *February 21, 2025*. Out of 111 pending bills, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) is monitoring 55 Tier 1 bills that could significantly impact community colleges, faculty, and students. Additionally, please review the <u>chaptered 2024 Legislation</u> that the President/CEO Cabinet is monitoring, as it may affect your area.

As mentioned in <u>previous President/CEO Messages</u> this month, we have had several productive meetings with our elected officials and key stakeholders in Sacramento and Washington D.C. We participated in bipartisan meetings to advocate for Compton College, Compton Community College District, and most importantly, our students. Follow-up meetings are scheduled over the next couple of weeks, and I am working on the many follow-up items from these discussions, which is a positive sign of their interest in more information.

Together, we will navigate these changes thoughtfully and effectively.
